Volunteer MBC officially launches Change The World - Ontario Youth Volunteer Challenge

April 3, 2009 - Mississauga, ON - Volunteer MBC officially launched today the ChangeTheWorld -Ontario Youth Volunteer Challenge and the list of environmentally-themed events that the volunteer centre is co-ordinating across the Region of Peel. The announcement was held at Glenforest Secondary School in Mississauga.

ChangeTheWorld is a provincial event co-ordinated by the Ministry of Citizenship and Immigration (MCI) in partnership with the Ontario Volunteer Centre Network (OVCN). This is the 2nd annual call to action for youth aged 14 to 18 years by volunteering individually or in groups through a wide variety of exciting community initiatives being held during National Volunteer Week (April 18 to 26, 2009). The goal is to have 10,000 students volunteer across the entire province during that week.

As a new volunteer centre serving the cities of Mississauga and Brampton, and the Town of Caledon, Volunteer MBC is pleased to be taking part in this initiative this year and has a target to engage 700 students across the Region.

"We've been visiting the secondary schools around the Region and have met some exemplary students who make every effort to give back to their community," stated Carine Strong, Director, Volunteer MBC. "This initiative is an opportunity for youth to gain 5 hours of recognition as a volunteer by participating in an event with their friends, or to meet new friends."

In Ms. Strong's speech during the launch she conveyed to youth, "You are the future of our community and you can make a difference – you can change the world".

The celebrity speaker who shared her own personal experience as a volunteer was Farah Nasser, Reporter for CityTV and alumni of Glenforest Secondary School.

All of the speakers encouraged youth to participate in the challenge and to be life-long volunteers. One such speaker, Michael Chan, Ontario Minister of Citizenship and Immigration stated, "Volunteering is an exercise in democracy. When you volunteer, you are shaping your community and ultimately, the society we all live in."

Other speakers included Councillor Peter Fonseca, MPP - Mississauga East-Cooksville and Minister of Labour; Saquib Mian, Chair of the Mississauga Mayor's Youth Advisory Committee; Eugene Wilson, Advisor of the Brampton Mayor's Youth Council; and the Principal of Glenforest, Cynthia Horvath.

Video messages were delivered from Emil Kolb, Chair, Region of Peel; Mayor Hazel McCallion of the City of Mississauga; and Rob Dyer of Skate4Kids.

Glenforest Secondary School, in its 40th year, offers an enhanced program for gifted students, as well as the International Baccalaureate Diploma programme and was an ideal location for the launch. "The students at Glenforest are so enthusiastic and really want to make a difference", noted Ms. Strong. Cynthia Horvath, Principal, echoed words of encouragement to the over 300 students who attended the launch about the benefits of volunteering.
